ASQ: G 02.02 Advancement to Fellow Membership

Total score is achieved by adding up the highest value from each of the six categories.

A minimum total score of 28 is needed for a member unit to make a nomination.

I:

A. Understands and applies basic quality improvement and management concepts. <i>[1 point]</i>
B. Understands and routinely applies quality and/or improvement-related concepts. <i>[2 points]</i>
C. Has been awarded ASQ's CQI, CQIA, CQPA, or equivalent. <i>[3 points]</i>
D. Has achieved useful or significant results through the application of quality-related concepts or has been awarded ASQ's CSSGB, CCT, or has been certified as an RABQSA QMS Auditor. <i>[4 points]</i>
E. Has developed and implemented significant new applications of quality and improvement-related concepts or has been awarded ASQ's CQA, CHA, CBA, CSSBB, CPGP, or been certified as an RABQSA QMS Lead or Senior Auditor. <i>[5 points]</i>
F. Has been awarded ASQ's CQE, CRE, CSQE, CMQ/OE, CMBB, or equivalent; has been awarded professional licensing/registration or similar recognition. <i>[6 points]</i>
G. Has made significant contributions to the development, understanding, and application of theoretical concepts and methods of quality and business improvement-related disciplines. <i>[7 points]</i>
H. Has received formal public recognition (beyond company or local community) for truly outstanding technical competence in quality and business improvement-related disciplines <i>[8 points]</i>

III:

A. Limited oral quality presentations at ASQ section meetings and meetings of other technical groups not involving a prepared paper; publication of articles in internal company newsletters or journals, speeches made or papers presented at internal company meetings or conferences. <i>[1 point]</i>
B. Frequent oral quality presentations at ASQ section meetings or meetings of other technical groups not involving a prepared paper, a single article in a section newsletter. <i>[2 points]</i>
C. Self-prepared papers distributed at talks to local groups or published in a local newsletter, 2 or more articles in a section newsletter, single article in a division newsletter. <i>[3 points]</i>
D. Papers presented at conventions, conferences, self-prepared. 2 or more articles in a division newsletter or self-published book on quality. <i>[4 points]</i>
E. Papers prepared and reviewed for presentation and publication in meeting transactions, etc., technical papers published in division newsletters or available through a division <i>[5 points]</i>
F. Papers prepared under editorial supervision for publication in technical journals or technical periodicals, e.g., <i>Quality Progress, Quality Management Journal, Quality Digest</i> , papers available through Quality Press <i>[6 points]</i>
G. Publication of papers containing original ideas, concepts, or applications, as recognized by independent experts in the field. <i>[7 points]</i>
H. Publication or editor of recognized (not self-published) trade book(s) or textbook(s), or author or editor of a single chapter <i>[8 points]</i>

IV:

A. Senior member of ASQ. <i>[1 point]</i>
B. Active member of a committee in the local section / chapter level or on-line community. <i>[2 points]</i>
C. Held office below chair or chair-elect in a section. Participant in a workshop associated with an ASQ certification exam. Moderator of an on-line community <i>[3 points]</i>
D. Held the office of Chair or chair-elect in a section. <i>[4 points]</i>
E. Active member of a Society committee, division committee, or interest group committee at the regional or national level, deputy regional director, country councilor, chair of a local conference or ASQ Editorial Review Board member. <i>[5 points]</i>
F. Society committee chair; regional or national director; division chair; senior editor of an ASQ-sponsored journal; or chair of a regional ASQ conference. <i>[6 points]</i>
G. ASQ elected officer at the national level; chair of Society conference at the national level. <i>[7 points]</i>
H. Especially long and outstanding service to the Society. <i>[8 points]</i>

V:

A. Membership in another quality-related professional organization that has an explicit focus in its stated purpose on quality-related methods or statistics. Duration of the membership or activity must be sufficient to demonstrate clear benefit or effective results. <i>[1 point]</i>
B. Has been an active member of industry, academic, government, on-line, or other formal committee that has an explicit focus in its stated purpose on quality-related methods or statistics. <i>[2 points]</i>
C. Has been a fellow or recipient of a special quality-related award from another organization. Moderator of an on-line community. <i>[3 points]</i>
D. Has been active in a quality-related committee of an organization that does not have quality-related activities as its primary focus; member of a state or regional quality award board of examiners, or member of the board of examiners for an organization-sponsored quality award (<i>USA Today/RIT Quality Cup, Team Excellence Award (not ASQ), Andersen Enterprise Award, etc.</i>). <i>[4 points]</i>
E. Has been functionally active in an organization that has an explicit focus in its stated purpose on quality-related methods or statistics, as an officer, committee chair, or similar leadership position; member of the board of examiners for a national quality award; or judge for a state or regional quality award. <i>[5 points]</i>
F. Has been functionally active in an organization that does not have quality-related methods or statistics as its primary focus, as an officer, committee chair or similar leadership position; judge for a national quality award (<i>Baldrige, President's Award, military service quality award, etc.</i>). <i>[6 points]</i>
G. Has been formally and effectively responsible for ASQ influence on the other organization's committees with a focus on quality-related methods or statistics. <i>[7 points]</i>
H. Formally recognized as having provided outstanding leadership in fostering liaison between ASQ and other organizations. <i>[8 points]</i>

VI:

A. Prepared and instructed employer-sponsored training course or seminar for basic quality-related topics, one or two sessions only. <i>[1 point]</i>
B. Prepared and instructed employer-sponsored training courses or seminars for basic quality-related topics, more than two sessions or for advanced quality related topics, one or two sessions only. <i>[2 points]</i>
C. Prepared and instructed ASQ or other recognized society-sponsored training courses or seminars for basic quality-related topics, one or two sessions only. <i>[3 points]</i>
D. Prepared and instructed ASQ or other recognized society-sponsored training courses or seminars for basic quality-related topics, more than two sessions. <i>[4 points]</i>
E. Prepared and instructed ASQ or other recognized society-sponsored training courses or seminars for advanced quality-related topics, one or two sessions only. <i>[5 points]</i>
F. Prepared and instructed ASQ or other recognized society-sponsored training course or seminar for advanced quality-related topics, more than two sessions. <i>[6 points]</i>
G. Prepared and instructed, on a part-time basis, quality-related courses at a university or college, over multiple academic years, paid by the university or college. <i>[7 points]</i>
H. Received formal recognition from ASQ, another recognized society, or a university or college for especially long and outstanding participation in quality-related teaching activities. <i>[8 points]</i>
